

CAMP CONDUCT GUIDELINES

Please feel welcome and enjoy the use of the campground. We are blessed to be able to use these grounds for a week of fun, fellowship and spiritual growth. As guests we will treat this facility and it's contents with respect.

1. **FOR EVERYONE'S SAFETY AND WELL BEING:**

*Do not leave the camp premises for any reason- the boundaries are marked and will also be explained at the beginning of camp.

*No water balloons or practical joke items allowed. Shaving cream is for shaving only!

*No portable DVD players, CD players, radios, ipods, etc. Our camp will not be responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items.

*Do not borrow anything from another camper without permission.

*Do not share brushes, combs or hats.

*NO ROUGH PLAY AT ALL in cabins, outside, etc. This also includes the pool. All campers will follow the rules for swimming (explained and displayed before swim time). The lifeguard is in charge and those not following the rules will be expelled from the pool.

2. Staff and cabin groups will have cleanup duties throughout the week. This keeps the facilities clean and it's quick and easy when everyone does their fair share.

3. We have great classes and activities planned. Please remember you need to be at these activities on time. You will hear the whistle being blown when it's time to go to a new activity. You will remain there until dismissed by the staff member in charge. If you need to leave for any reason ask the assisting staff for permission.

4. CELL PHONES- We understand parents send cell phones to check in with their children. This can cause disturbances during activities, etc. and we will not be responsible for lost, stolen or damaged cell phones. We ask that campers do not bring cell phones! We have a regular camp phone so campers and parents can keep in touch. We request that parents call during the following times as it is easier to locate the camper during meals.

8-9 AM...12-1PM...6-7 PM. The camp is called *Coastal Empire Camp* and the phone is **(912)829-3994**. We understand campers may have cell phones for reasons of safety during traveling. We ask that these be turned in at check-in and will be returned when leaving. AT NO TIME are campers denied communication with family.

5. To discipline means "to teach". These guidelines help teach us to cooperate and respect each other. When we treat each other as we would like to be treated everyone has a great time! If we do have a problem this is how its solved.

1st warning- staff and camper resolve the issue

2nd warning- special activities will be taken away

3rd warning- Parents will be notified and appropriate action taken

DRESS CODE

A dress code is "rules to follow when choosing clothes for going certain places or doing certain activities". It is not our purpose to tell you it is right or wrong to wear certain clothes. This is between you and the Lord. However, we are a **Church Camp** and in keeping with standards of spiritual and physical safety the Camp Coordinator and Camping Ministries Committee have chosen the following as our dress code. THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS!

GIRLS- Dresses/Skirts below the knee for evening worship.

BOYS-FULL length pants.

FULL length pants or dresses during the day. NO capris.

(certain styles of capris may be inappropriate so to be fair we simply are not allowing any capris)

EVERYONE- NO shorts...NO tank tops or sleeveless tops...NO tops with inappropriate logos...NO tight formfitting clothing (these may draw inappropriate attention to one's self)...All tops and bottoms must keep the stomach and back covered at all times.
